

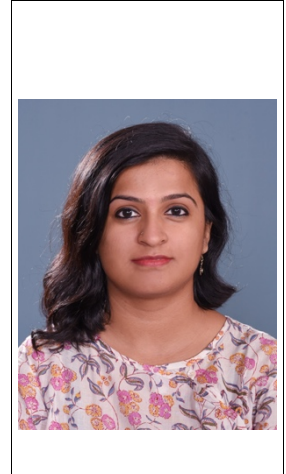


## **Reenu Punnoose**

### **Brief Summary of Research**

While my doctoral research involved an experimental phonetic study of the liquid consonants in Malayalam, my post-doctoral research was a sociophonetic examination of the impact of social class on the intra-regional phonological variation in urban Indian English. Both strands of research, the phonetic features of Malayalam and the sociophonetic relationships that characterise Indian English, continue to define my major research interests.
